LAS VEGAS, Nov. 9, 2021 – The Clark County Water Reclamation District reminds Southern Nevada residents to *Just Can It*. Dispose of waste such as fat, oil, grease, and grit (FOGG) in the trash, not down the drain. FOGG continues to be a leading cause of costly plumbing damage.

District General Manager Tom Minwegen says, “As we approach the time of year when we gather with family and friends, we ask residents to dispose of FOGG in the trash can and leave the plumber off the invite list this holiday season.”

Residents can do their part to prevent blockages by disposing of kitchen waste in the trash. For grease, Just Can It: after cooking, put cooled oil and grease into a can and throw it in the trash.
